ONE ADDITIONAL COVID-19 POSITIVE IN JACKSON COUNTY

Jackson County Health Department was notified in the past 24 hours of one Jackson County resident confirmed to have contracted COVID-19. The individual is a male in his thirties who acquired the disease through transmission in the community (i.e., unable to trace back to a known source). He is being placed in isolation.

To date, there have been 168 laboratory confirmed cases in Jackson County, including ten deaths related to the disease. Sixteen additional positive individuals have been released from isolation, in accordance with CDC guidelines, bringing the total recovered to 102 persons.

Looking at data of new confirmed cases in Jackson County over the past six weeks:

People can reduce the likelihood of contracting the disease by adhering to the Governor’s stay at home order, washing hands frequently, disinfecting commonly touched surfaces, wearing face coverings when inside public spaces, and maintaining space from others as much as possible.
